HFLA is a small Jewish agency dedicated to supporting the Jewish community with direct

cash payments through interest-free loans designed to meet the community's financial needs. During the pandemic, the need has increased to new levels.

Although small, we are able to punch above our weight through the power of recycling funds from one borrower to the next—recirculating your donations from one person, one business, one student to the next generation of individuals, businesses and students.

For over 100 years, HFLA was managed by a dedicated group of volunteers who awarded loans to those in need. Less than three years ago, the board made a bold decision to hire its first Executive Director, Maura Roberts. The board is grateful for Maura's leadership and dedication.

Covid-19 Relief Student Access Fund (SAF) Basic Needs Support

Our mission is simple and effective: To place funds into peoples' hands so they can move through a difficult time or access opportunity. HFLA trusts individuals to manage their own lives and respects each person's dignity.

HFLA provides interest-free loans for a wide variety of circumstances: To name a few examples: family emergencies, tuition assistance, rent and mortgage payments, medical and dental bills, divorce, car purchases & repairs, debt consolidation and life-cycle events (bar/bat mitzvah, wedding, funeral).

Sometimes HFLA loans are a necessary bridge just to make ends meet: With HFLA's help borrowers can overcome life emergencies, obtain the health care they need, nurture their families, maintain a roof over their heads, improve their long-term job prospects, ensure they have transportation, and pay for the basic services and utilities most of us take for granted.



75% of HFLA assets are at work in the community, including SAF funds that will be released to students for the 2021 academic year. Each month, assets fluctuate. Loans made reduce the endowment, and donor contributions and current borrowers' payments provide funding for new packages of financial support.





"Before Covid-19, I was working in hospitality.

Around Aug, I lost my job. I was struggling to pay my bills and even to put gas in my car. I had to swallow my pride and ask my parents for help.

But then, luckily a friend suggested I contact HFLA & very shortly after, I had a loan that has given me enough money to pay my bills while I look for another job."

"In February, I got a job at a small tech training company. During the 2nd week of COVID I was let go... It's a crazy time and I am so thankful for this amazing organization."

HFLA Answers: HFLA made a loan to help this individual meet their obligations and maintain their independence.

"I've lost some income because of current events (Covid); I teach at synagogues to supplement my income and those gigs are gone now.

Is it possible to renegotiate my monthly payment until my income recovers? Thank you for everything."

HFLA Answers: Yes of course, and deferred and reduced this individual's payments until circumstances improved.

We continue to evaluate our loan amounts as the cost of living in Washington increases and donors step up to make additional loans possible.

HFLA provides unique support to families that may otherwise be struggling to find enough money to cover their basic expenses.

The need in the community for HFLA is such that new donors and family foundations have sought out HFLA as a means of helping the community.

The Student Access Fund (SAF) A better way to fund college

The Student Access Fund (SAF) is a new, ambitious program to help our Jewish community's students afford university or vocational, technical, and community college studies. These loans have no-interest and no fees. SAF loans are designed to provide \$7,500 per student. This loan saves students and families thousands of dollars in unnecessary loan fees so they can use more of their earnings towards education expenses.

In 2020, HFLA provided **\$52,500** in financial aide to Jewish college students



Guided by our Jewish history and values, we provide assistance to individuals and families so they can access opportunity and make it through difficult times.
